1. Roll Call - All in attendance

Enrollment update post 10-day drop: 503 Scholars. These numbers are in line with last year, however we are still experiencing new scholar enrollment at this time.

Review of the first days of the school year:

What was right?

All were in agreement that our Meet the Teacher night went smoothly, splitting the times allowed for more open hallways, happier parents that felt they had better time to visit with the teachers and all around happier families. Scholars felt welcomed! Paul commented on the new positive atmosphere on both sites. Although it was a little off on the second week, this week has felt much more positive. Most felt this was due to the new scheduling, better support and communication. With some training with our Title 1 and SPED aides, teachers and scholars getting better services.

Scholars are excited about this opportunity, business plan and ability to have the program grow. We also have

an opportunity to purchase a freestanding complete barista unit. Discussed this with the group and the decision was made to purchase.
