Universal Screening Tool-

i-Ready/Curriculum Associates will be Desert Star Academy's provider for universal screening of scholars in our kindergarten programs and grades one through three, i-Ready is designed to identify scholars who have reading deficiencies pursuant to section 15-704. i-Ready/curriculum associates will be administered within forty-five calendar days after the beginning of each school year or within forty-five calendar days after a scholar enrolls.

Kindergarten Entry Assessment-

i-Ready/Curriculum associates will be required to administer the kindergarten. I-Ready will be used as a Kindergarten Entry Assessment. It will be administered within forty-five calendar days after the beginning of each school year or within forty-five calendar days after a scholar enrolls.

Parental classrooms visits, tours, and observations-

Parents/guardians must get approval from the Administration and all the classroom teachers that will be observed when they would like to observe the campus for the day. Parents must complete and have approved the School Day Visitor Form at least twentyfour (24) hours before the visit. Cuests are bound by the same rules as other scholars and will be expected to comply or leave the premises.

Bullying policy-

needs to add that parents will be notified by administration if they're scholar has been harassed, threatened or intimidating conduct against their scholar has been confirmed. A Harassment Report will be filled out by administration.

Crime Reporting-

Desert Star personnel will report any suspected crime against a person or property that is a serious offense, that involves a deadly weapon, a dangerous instrument, a serious physical injury, and any conduct that poses a threat of death or serious physical injury to an employee, scholar, or other person on the school property. A Crime Reporting form will be filled out by administration.

Religious Beliefs-

Desert Star Academy will permit a scholar to be excused from school attendance for religious purposes, including participation in religious exercises or religious instruction. A vacation form will need to be preapproved. It will be available through the secretary and given to the administration for approval.

Suspension and Expulsion

Desert Star may suspend or expel a scholar who is enrolled in a kindergarten program, first grade, second grade, third grade or fourth grade only if all of the following apply:

The scholar is seven years of age or older.

2. The scholar engaged in conduct on school grounds that meets one of the following

- (a) Involves the possession of a dangerous weapon without authorization from the school.
- (b) Involves the possession, use or sale of a dangerous drugs or a narcotic drug.

(c) Immediately endangers the health or safety of others.

(d) The scholar's behavior is determined by the school district governing board or charter school governing body to qualify as aggravating circumstances and that all the following apply:

(e) The scholar is engaged in persistent behavior that has been documented by the school and that prevents other scholars from learning or prevents the teacher from maintaining control of the classroom environment.

(f) The scholar's ongoing behavior is unresponsive to targeted interventions as documented through an established intervention process that includes consultation with a school counselor, school psychologist or other mental health professional or social worker if available within the school district or charter school or through a state-sponsored program.

(g) The scholar's parent or guardian was notified and consulted about the ongoing behavior.

- (h) Before a long-term suspension or expulsion, the school must provide the scholar with a disability screening and the screening finds that the behavioral issues were not the result of a disability.
- 3. Failing to remove the pupil from the school building would create a safety threat that cannot otherwise reasonably be addressed or qualifies as aggravating circumstances.
- 4. Before suspending or expelling the scholar, the charter considers and, if feasible while maintaining the health and safety of others, in consultation with the scholar's parent or guardian to the extent possible, employs alternative behavioral and disciplinary interventions that are available to the school, that are appropriate to the circumstances and that are considerate of health and safety. The charter school shall document the alternative behavioral and disciplinary interventions it considers and employs.

Firearms for grades Kindergarten through 4th grade Scholars in grades Kindergarten through 4th grade will be given a suspension of no more than 2 days and doesn't exceed the scholars 10-day aggregate suspension for the year.
